

Here's how the candidates stack up on the issues that count for PSEA members.



Josh Shapiro

- Listens to and respects educators and support professionals.
- Wants to address staffing shortages in our schools by increasing salaries.
- Will protect school employees' pensions and collective bargaining rights.³
- Will reduce high-stakes standardized testing in public schools.
- Believes educators deserve to have a strong voice in decisions affecting school curriculum and policies.
- Initiated and championed a youth violence prevention program that helps students with mental health issues. 6
- Wants to make sure our students have the tools they need to succeed.

Doug Mastriano

- X Wants to cut the state's public school funding in half, by more than \$10 billion, meaning fewer educators, counselors, and nurses in our schools. 1
- X Believes schools are overstaffed and educators are overpaid.²
- X Supports bills curtailing collective bargaining for fair salaries and benefits. 3
- X Doesn't think standardized testing is worth mentioning among his priorities.
- X Thinks public education is "broken" and educators are the problem. 4
- X Wants to force teachers to post online all the instructional materials they use in their classrooms. 5
- X Supports bills to use public school funding for private and religious school vouchers. 6
